An architectural marvel called Government Mohindra College, Patiala was established in 1875 with its foundation stone was laid by the then Viceroy of India Lord Northbrook and was named after Maharaja Mahendra Singh of Patiala. Initially it was affiliated to the University of Calcutta and later on became one of the affiliated college of the University of Punjab, Lahore's 1882. Following the partition of India in 1947, the college came under the purview of the Punjab University Chandigarh and in 1962 under the Punjabi University, Patiala.

Being ever responsive to the changes, embrace them wholeheartedly and adapt its strategies thereupon not only to sustain and deliver in the immediate context but to remain in the reckoning in the overall educational ecology of the Northern India has been the ultimate philosophy of the college. To cater to not only the present educational needs of the area but also proactively to the emerging ones has enabled the college to be in its own league and stay ahead of times in terms of offering a host of courses in as diverse disciplines as Egovernance and taxation, software development and computer programming etc. along with an array of traditional ones of the undergraduate and post graduate level.

The college was awarded the A+ Grade by the NAAC in April 2005 in the cycle I and in the cycle-II the college was laced with "A" Grade with CGPA 3.86 in Feb 2016, the highest score given to any college in Country. Earlier it had the Coveted status of "College, with Potential for Excellence" from University Grants Commission and was adjudged the star College in Life Sciences" by the department of Biotechnology (DBT), Government of India. The college continues to make rapid growth in academics, sports and cultural fields and this obviously is in consonance with the college missions and goals.

Rules for opting Punjabi Elementary in lieu of Punjabi Compulsory

A student can opt for Punjabi Elementary in lieu of Punjabi Compulsory in the following circumstances

- (i) He/She has passed Matriculation Examination from a Board outside Punjab.
- (ii) Wards of Defence/Paramilitary Personnel (either in Service or Retired) and in case of death of the Father, the Mother or the guardian of the candidate can give an affidavit that his/her ward has not studied Punjabi upto Matriculation.

The cases of above mentioned candidates along with complete documents will be sent for approval to the University within one month of the admission. The students of all undergraduate courses will have to pass papers in "Drug Abuse: Problem, Management and pervention" in the second Semester and "Environmental Studies" in the third semester besides other subjects.

Admission Rules

- 1. The admission is based on merit. A student aspiring for taking admission in the institution will have to appear in person before the admission committee. After recommendation by the admission committee approval is given by the Principal.
- 2. Every year admission is done on the basis a of new admission form. This rule applies to the old students of the institution also.
- 3. The signature of the parents/guardian is mandatory at the assigned place. In case of forgery admission will be cancelled. This applies to cases detected even after completion of admission process.
- 4. The contact no. of the Parent/Guardians has to be mentioned on the admission form so that he/she could be informed about the activities of his/her ward.
- 5. The students who have been unable to qualify the exam due to any circumstances, have been disqualified by the University or have left studies for many years will not be given admission in the same class.
- 6. If in any course, the college HEIS receives less than 50% applications for admission against the allotted no. of seats by the University, the college HEIS will not run the course and no admission will be done in that particular course at entry level.
- 7. If due to some reason the result has not been declared by the Punjab School Education Board/ Punjab University, the next date of admission will be put up on the notice board. This, however does not apply to the candidates of other universities.
- 8. The Principal has the discretionary power to refuse admission to any candidate.
- 9. The right to amendment of rules lies with the Principal.

Special Instructions for Students of Boards/Universities from outside Punjab:

- The students of Board/University from outside Punjab will be given admission as per rules/instructions laiddown by Punjabi University, Patiala. Such students will have to obtain Eligibility certificate from Punjabi University, Patiala prior to admission in the institution.
- As per instruction laid by Punjabi University, Patiala concerned students will have to submit their original details mark cards and original migration certificates in the college office, otherwise he/shehimself/herself will be responsible for the late fee taken by the University.

Special Note

As per the Syndicate of Punjabi University, Patiala (31-08-1993, Para 2.3) students who have not passed Punjabi in Matriculation examination and are seeking admission in Science, Commerce, Medical, and other Technical courses will have to pass Punjabi of Matric level or Punjabi Parveshika..

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR STUDENTS

Eligibility Conditions for appearing in the University Exams

Attendance and Fines

- A student is required to have minimum 75% attendance in the classes during the semester. Parents are required to keep a check on the attendance of their wards and contact the authorities regularly. No student with shortage in attendance will be allowed to appear in the University examination.
- A student who remains absent for a period/periods/or whole day will have to pay the fine as per college rules. Additional fine shall be imposed upon the students who remain absent in the tutorial group meeting.
- The name of the student who remains absent continuously for ten days will be struck off. The right to readmission is with the Principal. For readmission the student will have to pay the requisite fine and it will be his/her responsibility to fulfill the conditions laid down by the university.

Mid-Semester Tests (M.S.T.)

Students are required to clear two mid semester tests and fulfill other conditions laid down by the university. In this regard requisite information can be taken from the concerned departments.

College Leaving Rules

A student who wants to leave the institution will have to apply in writing. However, he/she will have to deposit the requisite fee and fines as per college rules till his/her name is officially struck off.

Identity Cum Library Card

Each student will be given an identity cum library card by the institution after his/her admission. It is the responsibility of the student to get it complete in all aspects and keep it with himself/herself during the college hours. On demand by any official of the institution, he/she will have to show the Identity card otherwise it will be considered as a breach of discipline. In case of loss, a duplicate card can be issued only after obtaining permission of the Principal and as per the rules.

Tutorial Groups & Buddy Groups

After admissions, students are inducted into tutorial groups. Personal help and guidance is provided to the students regarding their problems.

Information Regarding Leave

- Leave upto 6 days can be applied to the office after recommendation from the tutor.
- Leave for more than 6 days has to be recommended by the senior tutor. During the period of leave no fine will be taken but no compensation for lecture shortage will be granted.
- Students participating in any activity can have compensation for lecture shortage after getting their applications recommended from the concerned Teacher. Only the students, who have represented the college in any event/activity are entitled to such concession.
- For absence in mid-semester test (M.S.T.) a prior permission from the authority is required.



The Institute has a RUSA executive to look after the utilization of the various grants received under RUSA scheme. The institution has constructed a RUSA block with latest facilities besides a gym for the Girls hostel, furniture and an incinerators for the Girls common room and Girls Hostel for the institution.

Code of Conduct for Students

- 1. Ragging is banned in the Campus as per the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court.
- 2. Use of cigarette, tobacco and liquor is prohibited in the college premises. Crackers/fireworks are strictly banned.
- 3. Students must comply with the university conditions of 75% attendance, M.S.Ts and Assignments before sitting for final examination.
- 4. Mobile phones are not allowed in the class rooms, corridors and examination hall. Proper dress code is mandatory for all students.
- 5. The students must park their two wheelers (four wheelers not allowed) at the designated places in the college premises. College holds no responsibility for the vehicles parked outside.
- 6. No meeting by the students can be convened without the prior permission of the Principal. Holding meetings, Political rallies and Sticking posters are not allowed.
- 7. Use of Polythene bags is punishable in the college campus. It is the moral duty of the Students to keep the college campus clean & green.
- 8. No student is allowed to leave the college premises before 1:00 PM.
- 9. The concerned student will be liable to pay the penalty in the event of defacement of the college building by sticking posters etc. as per the orders of the honourable high court.
- 10. The direct contact or correspondence must be made with the Principal with regard to any matter like admission, struck off the name etc.
- 11. The students must carry their identity cards daily and show it to any official on their insistence or demand.
- 12. The students must keep them updated about every event or activity in the colleges which are either displayed on the display board or on the college website.
- 13. The SC category students will be liable to penal action and so lose their eligibility if the submitted income proofs are found to be wrong.
- 14. No student is allowed to bring or meet any outsider in the college and, in case of otherwise, will face disciplinary action.
- 15. The students must show respect towards the watchmen/ security guards deployed at the main gate.
- 16. The parents or the guardians must write their mobile number on the admission form to keep them updated through SMS about their wards' activities in the college.
- 17. Fire Arms are prohibited & is punishable under Arms Act & Security Act.
- 18. If any student damages the property of college, he/she has to pay for the loss.

Abiding by the college rules is mandatory for all the students. Any violation of rules will invite disciplinary action as per Govt. rules/law.

STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

To meet the academic and holistic development of students various support services has been established in the college.

- 1. Career Counseling and Placement Cell: This cell of the institute plays a very significant role in guiding students for the various career opportunities after the completion of their respective courses. Workshops, seminars, extension lectures are organized regularly, inviting experts from various fields. This helps students to become more skillful and employable. Campus placement drives are also organized regularly by the team of this cell with number of reputed companies. This cell also work in collaboration with Employment Generation and Training department of Govt. of Punjab for the welfare of the students. During the session 2022-33 around 105 students from different course got placements in various diverse fields.
- 2. NCC, NSS & Red Cross Brigades: NCC plays a vital role in inculcating in our youth the spirit of patriotism, discipline and good citizenship. Our college has three NCC wings. Students have the choice of opting for one of the three i.e. Infantry Wing, Air Wing and Navy Wing for both boys and girls. Our cadets have brought many laurels to the college at National Level. Many NCC Cadets have been selected in defence services. NSS aims at developing among students a sense of participation in nation building through social work. Motto of NSS is 'NOT ME BUT YOU'. Our college has 5 NSS units Our College has 2 Units of Red Cross (One for Girls and One for Boys). Students who join RED CROSS get training of Home Nursing and First Aid.
- **3. Students' Clubs:** Various clubs in the college have been established to make students aware of their health and all-round development to raise their interest in cultural, arts & co-curricular activities viz. Red Ribbon Club, Mohindra Youth Club, Mohindra Health Club, Mohindra Divinity Club, Mohindra Photography Club, Sadbhawna Club and Mohindra Readers Club. Students can get registered to these clubs after getting admission in the college.
- **4. Students' Societies:** Students are also encouraged for co-curricular activities besides studies. To achieve this motive, Punjabi Sahit Sabha, Hindi Sahitya Sabha, English Literary and Theatre Society, Mohindra History Society, Political Science Association, Public Administration Association, Planning Forum, Environment Society and Botanical Society exists which organize extension lectures/workshop, educational tours and seminars, Plantation drives and celebrate various important days like earth day, world science day, environment day for students.
- **5. Grievances Redressal Committee:** A Grievances Redressal Committee has been constituted in the institute for the redressal of students grievances and to give a practical form to their suggestions. For this the students can use the complaint\suggestion box hanging outside the office.
- **6. RTI Act 2005- \ Legal Cell:** RTI Act-2005 has been applicable since 12-10-2005 & following the instructions of Govt. of Punjab, a legal cell has been established in the institution. Any citizen can ask for information by giving an application.
- **7. Punjab Right to Service Act-2011**: following the institution laid down by government of Punjab a special cell has been established in the institution which from time to time provides the information about Punjab Right to service Act to the Students.
- **8. College Dispensary:** Immediate medical facilities are provided to the students through Red Cross volunteers.
- **9. College Magazine 'Mohindra':** to inspire the students with creative skills, college Magazine "Mohindra is published every year. This magazine has eight segments: Punjabi, Hindi, English, Sanskrit, News, Culture Planning forum. Students can get their original writings published in the college magazine

THE CAMPUS

Our College Campus Offers:

- **1. Computer Labs:** There are four labs in the College having latest technology viz. computers along with printers, multimedia projectors, Scanners etc. These labs have around 200 computers in total with Internet facility.
- **2. Smart Class Rooms:** The college has four fully equipped Smart Class Rooms with Visualizers, LCD Projectors, Smart Boards. The college is also planning to setup more such Smart Class Rooms in the coming Session.



The Bio-Technology department has two well equipped Labs with Laminar Air flow, UV-VIS Spectrophotometer, Incubators, Centrifuge, Electrophoretic Apparatus, etc..

The Chemistry department has well equipped labs with instruments like pH meter, Potentiometer, Conductometer, mechanical shaker, UV/ VIS spectrophoto-meter etc. Facility for smart classrooms and Internet is also available.

The Physics department has two spacious Labs and one dark room with Michelson interferometer, Fabry perot interferometer, Babinet compensator, Basic laser kit, G.M counter, Research spectrometer, Quincke's tube apparatus, Four probe method for measuring band gap, CROS, Bench model of Telescope and microscope.

- **4. Library:** The College has a huge and rich library having almost one lac twenty thousand books covering all the variegated areas ranging from Sciences to Social Sciences, Languages, Commerce, Management and Computer Sciences etc. The library has to its credit a number of very rare manuscripts. The library is proposed to be made completely digital along with hard copies in the coming time. E-catalogue is available for the books in the library. There are three sections of the library:-
- 1) General Section 2) Text Book Section 3) Periodical Section: In addition to the main Library, the respective departments have their own departmental libraries to provide additional support system in academics to the students concerned.
- **5. Sports Infrastructure:** The College has a well maintained Playground having a 400 meters track for athletics and infrastructure for multiple games like Basket-ball, Volleyball, Football, Hockey, Kabaddi etc. The College has gym facility for students as well as faculty.









- **6. Multipurpose Hall:** This hall has a seating capacity of nearly 400 students and is used for both academic and cultural programmes.
- **7. Girls' Common Room:** The College has a girls' Common Room equipped with drinking water facility and attached washrooms etc. The room is properly ventilated, well-lit, neat and clean to provide a friendly ambience to its users.
- **8. Girls' Hostel:** The College has well furnished girls' hostel with a quality mess and student friendly infrastructure. An added feature of the girls' hostel is the availability of occupancy at very low cost and nominal rates. Students are accommodated purely on the basis of merit. For hostel accommodation a separate form worth Rs 100 has to be filled.
- **9. Botanical Garden/Environment Park:** Environmental protection and conservation of biodiversity are the things to be taken into consideration religiously and given top priority. To make the students aware of the importance of plants in the prevention of environmental pollution and their importance as medicine, fruit, wood providers etc. an environment park has been established in the college. This small area houses plants like Amla, Bel, Baheda, Turmeric, Rudraksh, Elaichi, Ak, Ashwagandha, Karonda, Jamun, Peach, Kachnar, Triveni, Sheesham, Mushkapoor, Cactus, Succulents and Thuja etc.
- **10. Lawns** Besides a Rose garden, the campus has several beautiful green lawns and belts, where students can relax in their free time. It further adds to the greenery of the college campus.
- **11. Canteen:** Two spacious and hygienic canteens are available for boys and girls separately. They provide a variety of eatables to the students.
- **12. Bank Facility:** An extension counter of Punjab National Bank of Commerce is situated in the premises of the college for the convenience of students and faculty members.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell
